Pelican Class History

The Pelican evolved from a pram bowed (blunt nosed) tender that was refined in the 1950s to be a multi-purpose vessel that could be fitted with a make shift rig and sailed as well as rowed, sculled, and with an outboard motor. The Pelican was initially built of timber and became popular as a training and competitive racing dinghy, which led to an association being formed to control and promote the class.

The Inaugural State Championship was sailed in 1958.

The Pelican took over the role of the Vee Jay as the junior trainer in the 1960s and spread to most sailing clubs on the Swan River as well as many country clubs, reaching a peak of 270 boats in the mid 1970s. In 1984 aluminium spars were introduced and fibre glass hulls built the following year.

The Pelican Sailing Association has maintained a steady number of registered boats in recent years. Today, Pelicans are sailed at the East Fremantle Yacht Club, South of Perth Yacht Club, Geraldton Yacht Club, Geographe Bay Yacht Club, Wal- pole Yacht Club and Esperance Bay Yacht Club.

The class has maintained large and consistent fleet sizes at State Championships and Yachting WA training events, ensuring the Pelican's position as the choice training and racing boat for many new junior sailors throughout Western Australia.

1. RULES

- **1.1** The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, which includes the Prescriptions and Special Regulations of Australian Sailing and the rules of the Pelican Sailing Association (Inc.)
- 1.2 Competitors' attention is directed to the requirements of Australian Sailing Special Regulations
- Part 2, Regulation 5.01 (Personal Flotation Devices) which requires personal buoyancy when racing

2. Notices to Competitors

Notice to competitors will be posted to the notice board located inside the Training room at GBYC

3. Change to Sailing Instructions

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted not less than 1 hour before the first race of the day in which it will take effect, except any change in the schedule of races will be posted by 0800 on the day of racing

4. Signals made ashore

- **4.1** Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flagpole near the rigging area adjacent to the GBYC
- **4.2** When flag A.P is displayed ashore '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in race signals, postponement signals A.P

- **5.2** Schedule of races may change at the discretion of the Race Committee.
- **5.3 Briefings** A briefing will be held at 0830 hrs on Monday 6th January 2025 in the Training room at Geographe Bay Yacht Club. Other Briefings will be held at the discretion of the race committee.
- **5.4** No warning signal will be made after 1300hrs on Friday, 10th January 2025.

6. Class Flag

The class flag will be a black pelican insignia on a white background

7. Race Area

Attachment 'B' shows the approximate location of the racing area

8. The Course

- 8.1 Attachment 'C' shows the courses that will be used. The course length is determined by the Race Officer
- 8.2 The course to be sailed will be indicated by a numeral pennant displayed from the staff on the race committee boat:
 - Pennant 1: Triangle-Windward-Leeward course
 - Pennant 2: Windward-Leeward course
 - Pennant 3: Windward-Leeward course

9. Marks

- 9.1 Marks 1,2,3 will be an inflatable Mark, coloured Yellow
- 9.2 New marks as provided in Instructions 12 will be an inflatable mark, coloured White
- 9.3 The starting mark will be a round Orange mark

10. Obstructions

- The jetty
- Other boats

11. The Start

- 11.1 Races will be started using RRS Rule 26 with the warning signal made 5 minutes before the start signal
- **11.2** The starting line will be between the staff displaying the orange flag on the race committee boat at the starboard end And the port end round orange starting pin mark
- **11.3** A boat starting later than 10 minutes after the starting signal will be scored 'did not start'. This changes RRS Rules A4 and A5

12. Changes of the next leg of the course

To change the next leg of the course, the Race Officer will lay a new mark(or move the finish line) to a new position

13. The Finish

- **13.1** The finish line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the committee boat at the starboard end and the port end round orange finishing pin mark
- **13.2** (SP)Except when starting, finishing or correcting an error in compliance with Rule 28.1, boats shall not sail through the Start or Finish line in either direction while the race committee boat is displaying an orange or blue flag. Boats failing to comply with the SI will be scored a 5 point penalty for that race without a hearing. This changes Rule 63.1 and A5

14. Penalty System

RRS Rule 44.2 is changed so that the two-turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty

15. Time Limits and Target Times

- **15.1** For the long races the time limit will be 2 hours. Boats failing to finish within 45 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored 'did not finish', this changes RRS Rules 35,A4 and A5
- **15.2** For the short races, the time limit will be 1 hour. Boats failing to finish within 30 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored 'did not finish', this changes RRS Rules 35, A4 and A5
- 15.3 After finishing race 3, boats should remain in the racing area unless directed otherwise

16. Arbitration

At the discretion of the Protest Committee, an arbitration hearing may be heard prior to a protest hearing, involving an alleged breach of a rule of RRS. After the written protest form is properly lodged, one representative from each boat shall meet with the arbitrator and no witnesses will be allowed. Protests not resolved by arbitration will be heard by the Protest Committee

17. Protests and Requests for Redress

- **17.1** Protest forms are available at the Race Committee office
- 17.2 Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered there within the appropriate time limit

- **17.3** For this regatta the protest time limit is 30 minutes after the last boat has finished each race except when the race is back- to- back
- **17.4** If a competitor intends to protest for an incident occurring during a race, they shall verbally notify the Principal Race Officer on the Start Boat of the protestee(s) sail number immediately after finishing and receive acknowledgement.
 - Alternatively, if not a finisher, the protester must notify the Beach Marshall of their intention to protest IMMEDIATELY upon returning to shore. This changes rule 61.
- 17.5 Notices will be posted no later than 60 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the GBYC Training room
- 17.6 Notices of protests by the Race Committee or protest committee will be posted under RRS rule 61.1
- **17.7** Breach of Sailing Instructions will not be grounds for a protest by a boat. This changes RRS Rule 60.1(a). Penalties for these breaches may be less than disqualification if the protest committee so decides
- 17.8 On the last scheduled day of racing a request for reopening a hearing shall be delivered
 (a) Within the protest time limit if the requesting party was informed of the decision on the previous day
 (b) no later than 30 minutes after the requesting party was informed of the decision on the day. This changes RRS
 Rule 66
- **17.9** On the last scheduled day of racing a request for redress based on a protest committee decision shall be delivered no later than 30 minutes after the decision was posted. This changes RRS Rule 62.2
- **17.10** Appendix T Arbitration will apply
- 17.11 The Race Committee will use a jury boat if required without notice to the competitiors

18.0 Scoring

- **18.1** The scoring system is as follows: For the Championship
- **18.2** Four races are required to be completed to constitute a series
- **18.3** (a) when fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boats series score will be the total of the race scores (b) when from 5-7 races have been completed, a boats series score shall be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score
- **18.4** The scoring system is as follows: For the Consistency Series
 - (a) Consistency will be determined and adjusted at the discretion of the Race Committee and are not subject to protest or redress
 - (b) When from 5-7 races have been completed, a boats series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score

18.5 Team Series

- (a) A Team competition will be run in conjunction with the Championship
- (b) Appendix D, Team Racing Rules, shall not apply and team racing tactics shall not be used
- (c) Each club may enter 1 or more teams. Each team will comprise of 5 boats. Clubs with less than 5 boats may make up a team with boats from other clubs by mutual agreement
- (d) Team compositions shall be finalised on Registration Day
- (e) Team scores will be calculated from each individual boats score in the championship. The team shield will be awarded to the team with the lowest aggregate score



19.0 Safety Regulations

- **19.1** The helm person of each entry boat shall personally sign on the official Sign on sheets located outside the Training room at GBYC, prior to the commencement of each race. For 'back-to-back' races, this requirement applies prior to the first 'back-to-back' race of the day. Any boat failing to comply will have 3 points added to her score for that race or the first 'back-to-back' race of the day
- **19.2** the helm person of each entry boat shall personally Sign Off the official Sign On sheets located outside the Training room at GBYC within 30 minutes of returning to shore after each race. For 'back-to-back' races the requirement applies after the last 'back-to-back' race of the day. Any boat filing to comply will have 3 points added to her score for that race or the last 'back-to-back' race of the day
- **19.3** Boats intending to start shall report to the Race Committee boat (when on station) prior to warning signal for each race. Each boat shall hail the Race Committee boat and receive verbal acknowledgement
- **19.4** A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee, the Beach Marshall or a recue boat within 30 minutes of beaching their boat
- 19.5 the decision not to start a race will be at the sole discretion of the Principal Race Officer

20.0 Replacement of Crew or Equipment

- **20.1** Substitution of competitors will not be allowed without prior written approval of the race committee. Requests shall be made on forms available at the Race Office. Changes will only be permitted in exceptional circumstances and if granted, will be given in writing
- **20.2** Substitution of damaged or lost equipment will not be allowed unless approved by the race committee with the exceptions of bailing buckets retrieved by official boats for safety reasons. Requests for substitution shall be made to the race committee at the first reasonable opportunity, on forms available at the Race Office. If damage occurs on the water, equipment may be substituted before the following race and written permission shall be requested before the end of the protest time on the same day. Changes will only be permitted in exceptional circumstances and if granted, will be given in writing
- **20.3** Competitors with damage or lost equipment may seek consideration for additional time/gear replacement between 'back to back' races by drawing it to the attention of an official boat as soon as possible, but no later than the warning signal for the second 'back to back' race, and the request will be considered by the Principal Race Officer
- **20.4** there shall be no request for redress for any actions by the Principal Race Officer in applying this Sailing Instruction. This changes RRS Rule 62.1

21.0 Equipment and Measurement Checks

- **21.1** Official Registration and Measurement takes place at GBYC and will be conducted between 1000 1600 hours on Sunday 5^{th} of January 2025
- **21.2** A boats equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the Class Rules and sailing instructions. On the water, a boat can be instructed by the Race Committee inspector or measurer to proceed immediately to a designated area for inspection

22.0 Advertising

Boats shall not display advertising unless authorised by the Organising Authority being the 67th Pelican State Championship Race Committee

23.0 Official Boats

Official boats will display a white/green flag

24.0 Support Boats

Team leaders, coaches and other support personnel shall stay well outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the preparatory signal to start until all boats have finished or retired, or the Race Committee signals a Postponement, general recall or abandonment except where asked to assist by the Race Committee

25.0 Rubbish Disposal

Boats shall not put rubbish into the water. Rubbish may be placed aboard support and race committee boats

26.0 Radio Communication

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to II boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones

27. Prizes

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS rule 4, Decision to Race which states that "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."

The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.

29. Insurance

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of 10 million dollars per event or the equivalent.


